Since 2014, the Atlantic City Housing Authority has been partnered with Stockton University and the Atlantic City Policeott. (ACPD) in conducting a Homework Completion program for the young residents of Stanley Holmes Village and Buzby Village. The program is held in our community rooms, right after school every day that school is in session.

> The program has been tremendously valuable for these boys and girls in ways we could not have imagined when we first began the program. Initially, we

wanted to lend academic assistance in a safe, secure environment. The partnership with ACPD was meant to establish police officers as positive role models for the youth living in Public Housing. The relationships which have formed between the participants, the Stockton tutors and the police otherwise recognized in their home life, now have a sense of confidence and achievement which will take them a long way, beyond what is learned in books and lesson plans.

Each year, the number of participants at each site grows larger and larger. Parents have come to learn, through word of mouth, that the Homework Completion Program is a valuable resource and partner to help educate and mentor ther children. The Program periodically reaches out to these parents and invites them in so they can
