

## RESIDENTIAL LIFE

### ITEMS AND ACTIONS NOT PERMITTED

- x Bed or furniture reducing the required width of the exit
- x Items hanging from the sprinkler head or pipe, heat detector, smoke detector or alarm
- x Unattended cooking, burning candle, or other open flame
- x Presence of candles of any type or form, oil lamp, or incense
- x Tampering with building fire alarm system
- x Discharge of Fire Extinguisher
- x Failure to evacuate building during an actual fire alarm or evacuation drill
- x Excessive quantity of combustible materials on walls or ceilings. Posters, fish nets or tapestry

- x Electrical cords (extension cords) are for temporary use only and are not permitted to be used as a substitute for permanent wiring. Electrical appliances must be plugged directly into an electrical outlet or an approved and



employee, or student planning to operate an UAS as part of their University employment or used in support of research, teaching, or testing as part of a University program near any residential life area must first contact the Director for Residential Life or their designee for approval

- x Waterbeds, water furniture, hot tubs, spas, and jacuzzis are prohibited in all inside, outside, and immediately adjacent to the residential complexes
- x No person shall feed any unconfined wildlife located on University property, except when such wildlife is part of approved academic research. Feeding does not include baiting or trapping by persons fishing with licenses. No hunting of any kind is permitted on campus. Feeding occurs when one gives, places, exposes, deposits, distributes, or scatters a material with the intention of feeding, attracting, or enticing wildlife.
