John Scarpa, Judge Salas Among Recipients of Hughes Center Honors Awards on Nov. 9

Galloway, N.J. — Philanthropist and business leader John F. Scarpa will receive the Distinguished Lifetime Achievement Award for his contributions to New Jersey public life at the Hughes Center Honors on Nov. 9, 2023.

Scarpa received honorary doctorate degrees from the American University of Rome, Italy, and Villanova University, where the Villanova Law School building was named "John F. Scarpa Hall" in honor of his charitable giving. Villanova also established the John F. Scarpa Chair in Catholic Legal Studies and the John F. Scarpa Center for Entrepreneurship and Law.

He and his wife, Jana, split their time living in Avalon, Cape May County, and Palm Beach, Florida.

Past Lifetime Achievement Award recipients include the late former New Jersey Governors Brendan Byrne and Jim Florio, former Governors Thomas Kean and Christine Todd Whitman, and the late Ambassador Hughes, who was presented his award in 2017 by then-former Vice President Joe Biden.
