GALLOWAY TWP., NJ – An exhibit featuring artifacts from the life of Holocaust survivor Hanna Granek Ehrlich will be on display starting Sunday, April 15 at the Sara and Sam Schoffer Holocaust Resource Center here,

The exhibit will open at 1 p.m. on the second floor of the Resource Center and is open to the public. It features artifacts from Hanna Granek Ehrlich's life before, during and after World War II. There are items from her hometown of Bedzin, Poland, from the Bedzin Ghetto, the Graditz Labor Camp the Peterswaldau Concentration Camp and from Munich, Germany.

The exhibit will be introduced by historians Dr. Michael Hayse and Dr. Mary Johnson, both of whom recently visited Bedzin.
